## OF CLASSIC & CULT FILMS SET IN NYC

"Movie Nights On The Elevated Acre" to Feature *Desperately Seeking Susan*, *The Godfather: Part II*, and *The Brother From Another Planet*– and free popcorn

(New York, NY – May 9, 2011) – A trio of classic and cult films spotlighting three distinct faces of New York City will be presented for free at a stunning Downtown outdoor oasis as part of the Movie Nights On The Elevated Acre series during this summer's 10<sup>th</sup> annual River To River® Festival.

On June 20, June 27, and July 11, Movie Nights On The Elevated Acre will screen a film set in an iconic version of New York, coupled with independent shorts by New York City filmmakers exploring their city. The Monday night series will once again alight on the Elevated Acre at 55 Water Street, a spectacular open-air plaza that overlooks the East River, and fresh popcorn will be distributed for free from popcorn carts.

This year's lineup explores themes of immigrants to New York City from three distinct perspectives – a suburbanite, an Italian immigrant, and an actual space alien. This year's films include *Desperately Seeking Susan* (June 20), a paean to 1980s Downtown Manhattan that features Madonna in her first movie role; *The Godfather: Part II* (June 27), the mob classic that casts the New York immigrant experience in a Shakespearean light; and *The Brother From Another Planet* (July 11), the cult classic that follows a mute alien through the streets of 1980s Harlem. These disparate takes on newcomers' experiences of New York City highlight the fantastic diversity that makes up our city.

"Watching movies on the Elevated Acre at the River To River Festival is the ultimate New York experience," said Sam Miller, President of Lower Manhattan Cultural Council (LMCC), the new lead partner of River To River Festival. "Each

of this year's films presents New York as almost a character in its own right, and there's no better place to watch these three unique stories unfold than on a green oasis overlooking the city that defines them."

Before each feature, acclaimed independent filmmakers Marie Losier, Maria Niro, and Henry Hills will each screen their short films. See below for details.

Tickets are required for each screening and will be available, two per person, at the street-level Water Street entrance to the Elevated Acre on a first-come, first-served basis starting at 6pm on the day of the screening.
